Introduction

Singing and enjoying music together is valuable as babies enjoy hearing a range of sounds and rhythms. As you sing songs and enjoy music, your baby hears new speech sounds and words.

It's important that your baby can see your face and hear what you are saying. Watching your face and mouth when you are singing helps your baby link your voice to the sounds they can hear. They watch the way your mouth moves when you are talking and singing. This helps them copy as they learn to make sounds themselves.

Singing with family and friends helps your baby interact with them and build close relationships.

When you repeat songs again and again (even if it drives you mad), it helps your baby's brain make connections and remember it next time.

When your baby anticipates what is coming next in the song/rhyme, they are developing good listening skills. For example, in "Round and Round the Garden" your baby will wait excitedly for the "tickly under there" to happen.




